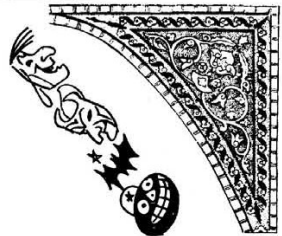

Hartt Symphony Nov. 6

The Hartt Symphony Orchestra will be conducted by Nathan Gottschalk at its Thursday, November 6 performance, at 8:30 p.m. in Millard Auditorium of Hartt College of Music, University of Hartford.

Dr. Gottschalk, executive director of Hartt, will direct the 80-member orchestra in Johannes Brahms' "Academic Festival Over-

ture, Opus 80," Robert Schumann's "Rhenish" Symphony (No. 3 in E flat Major, Opus 97), and Anton Dvorak's "Concerto Opus 53 for Violin and Orchestra."

Violin soloist will be Josef Synovec, a candidate for the artist diploma at Hartt College. There is no admission charge and the public is invited to attend.

Expanded

Jon Arlen McClure, an instructor, and Mrs. Joyce E. Milliken, a lecturer, have joined the Department of Speech and Drama in the School of Arts and Sciences, University of Hartford.

McClure is teaching three fall sections of "Effective Speaking," an advanced speech class in "Persuasion and Public Speaking," and a late afternoon course in "Introduction to Television and Radio." Mrs. Milliken's assignment includes classes in "Effective Speaking," an upper-level course in "Classical and Modern Rhetoric," and a senior-level class in "Argumentation and Debate."

With Fall Semester studies well under way, expanded enrollment in speech and drama offerings, taken by both full-time and evening students, has entailed the recruitment of a faculty with diverse experience in the fields of speech, drama, public relations, education and television.

Prof. Edgar L. Klotten, long-time director of the University Players, is currently acting department chairman. Prof. John Balmer, like Prof. Klotten a drama critic, directs the department's Readers Theatre program.

Mark Wallace, an assistant professor, is associate director of the University Players. Mrs. Rosalie H. Smith, also an assistant professor, is director of the UofH Speech Clinic.

Two Instructors Join Faculty of CBS

Mrs. Francis C. Almqvist, an instructor in mathematics, and Mrs. Sandra L. Katz, an instructor in English, have joined the faculty of the College of Basic Studies, University of Hartford.

Organized three years ago, the College of Basic Studies offers a two-year liberal arts and science program. Most CBS graduates transfer to four year schools. The CBS program is directed by Dean Kenneth L. Meinke.
